Participated in the design and successful implementation of the health sector reform in Zaire. The reform made it possible for health services in Congo to remain robust despite the civil unrest in that country

In collaboration with CDC Atlanta, Le Centre International pour l'Enfance, and the Antwerp Tropical Institute, initiated the training of Zairian medical officers in District Health Management, the first course to integrate disease control and health system management

Led the design and implementation of the Local Health Information System. Based on the local monitoring of 70 indicators, the system was handled locally, and backed up by an Apple 2C
